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## **Conference Overview and History**

### **Purpose:**

Here in the vast Cascadia region, we will gather to build regional cooperative support of local food systems. We call upon cooperatives large and small: farmers, growers, producers, distributors, financers, policymakers and retailers, to share their successes, expand their toolkit, and strengthen relationships across the Cascadia region of Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, western Montana, and with our friends across the nation.

### **Objectives:**

- 1.Strengthen economic systems by developing cooperative business skills to support successful ventures
- 2.Create strategic alliances and strengthen relationships between cooperatives
- 3.Raise awareness about the importance of access to local foods and the role that all co-ops play in developing local and regional food systems
- 4. Celebrate successful examples and learn from other cooperative

#### **Conference Themes:**

Many rural communities throughout the Northwest want a food cooperative in their community. Their primary reason is to have access to the bountiful foods grown in the region. Yet a local food system relies on more than just producers and consumers, it requires a strong infrastructure and cooperation amongst multiple sectors. This conference seeks to cut across these sectors and to encourage conversation and collaboration amongst conference attendees. Cultivating Cooperative Roots will not be based on any one sector but will focus on four major themes that all coops can relate to: Accounting and Financing, Communication, Governance, Financing, and Marketing.

#### The Roots of This Year's Conference:

The Northwest has been a hotbed for the local food movement. Our goal has been to bring to the forefront how many sectors touch the food movement, including the rural electric cooperatives that are instrumental in providing needed infrastructure, cooperative financial institutions and their understanding of the cooperative business model in financing cooperative food/farming ventures, the many commodity cooperative agriculture associations and the health industry.

The 2016 Cultivating Cooperative Roots Conference continues the themes from previous conferences and is based on the concept of bringing together co-ops and people interested in forming and strengthening co-ops from a variety of sectors using access to local foods as the common denominator.
